MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING WITH A CONCENTRATION IN ADULT GERONTOLOGY- ACUTE CARE NURSE PRACTITIONER (MSNAGACNP)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This online graduate degree in nursing will provide students with the academic knowledge, skills, and abilities to apply for certification as a Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner. Graduates will be prepared to have integrated praxis philosophy throughout multiple courses. Courses consist of core graduate courses, specialty concentration courses, and clinical courses. This program is for licensed registered nurses (current, unrestricted license) who have a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree and are interested in advancing their careers to become certified as an Adult Gerontology Acute Care (AGACNP) Nurse Practitioner.

Prior to enrollment, individuals considering the Master of Science in Nursing program, particularly the Adult Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner concentration, should be aware of their state requirements regarding required clinical courses and eligibility to apply for licensure.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN NURSING WITH A CONCENTRATION IN ADULT GERONTOLOGY- ACUTE CARE NURSE PRACTITIONER – ACCELERATED RN-MSN (MSNAGACNPA)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This online graduate degree in nursing will provide students with the academic knowledge, skills, and expertise to apply for certification as a family nurse practitioner in primary care. Graduates will be prepared to have integrated praxis philosophy throughout multiple courses. Courses consist of bridge, core, specialty concentration, and clinical courses. This program is for licensed registered nurses (current, unrestricted license) with an Associate Nursing degree interested in advancing their careers to become certified adult gerontology acute care nurse practitioners.

Individuals considering the Accelerated Master of Science program, should be aware that state requirements for availability of required clinical courses and eligibility to apply for licensure as an adult gerontology acute care nurse practitioner vary from state to state. Applicants should check with their state board of nursing before enrolling in any graduate nursing program. Students enrolled in this program are not eligible to receive a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
