CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION IN DENTAL RADIOLOGY

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will provide the student with the necessary background knowledge of ionizing radiation including the following: history of dental radiography; image and x-ray production; radiation safety; patient and operator protection and quality assurance. Students will use paralleling and bisecting techniques to produce images. The advantages and disadvantages of each of those techniques will be discussed. Errors in exposure, developing, and mounting will be addressed. Students will be given the opportunity to expose, process, mount, and evaluate the diagnostic value of images. Procedural techniques for exposing extraoral accessory images utilized in dental offices will be introduced.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this program, the student should be able to:

1. Describe the components of radiation production.
2. Describe the process to produce a diagnostically acceptable set of films on a patient, utilizing proper infection control and radiography safety techniques.
3. Analyze radiographs for oral anatomy landmarks and pathologies.
4. Produce a diagnostically acceptable set of films utilizing proper infection control and radiography safety techniques.

POTENTIAL OCCUPATIONAL TITLES

Potential occupational titles for this program include, but are not limited to, Unlicensed Dental Assistant with Limited Radiology Registration.

Note: Additional steps are required to obtain the Limited Radiology Registration.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Individuals applying for the Certificate of Completion in Dental Radiology program must be actively employed in a dental office and obtain sponsorship from a licensed dentist.

In addition to completing this Certificate of Completion, to obtain the Limited Radiology Registration, the Minnesota Board of Dentistry requirements are as follows:

3100.1320 LIMITED RADIOLOGY REGISTRATION

- Evidence of passing a board-approved nationally recognized radiation examination within the past five years_
- Evidence of passing the board's jurisprudence examination within the past five years_
- Documentation of current CPR certification_
- Criminal background check_
- Two hours of infection control education

- **ADDENDUM, effective July 11, 2022, Summer B Session. The following is added to all nursing programs.**

Students who graduate from a nursing program of study are generally not eligible for employment until they successfully pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX) exam. Herzing University is committed to supporting nursing graduate success on the NCLEX. The University incorporates the use of third-party exams in nursing curriculum to validate NCLEX readiness. In the event that a student is unable to demonstrate the required level of competence on an NCLEX readiness exam, he/she must successfully complete a remediation plan and retake the exam, attaining the required level of competence, before being permitted to progress in or complete the program of study. Engagement in remediation and retesting may extend the program of study and/or delay graduation.

- **ADDENDUM, effective June 20, 2022. The following is added to the Required Courses in the Associate of Science in Surgical Technology – Online program.**

Special Grading Requirements for Surgical Technology Courses

All Surgical Technology courses must be completed with a grade of “C” (76%) or better for a student to be continued in the Surgical Technology program.

- **ADDENDUM, effective May 16, 2022. The admission requirements for the following programs have been updated.**

Associate in Science / Associate of Applied Science in General Studies – Pre-Nursing

Applicants must meet all the following criteria:

- A high school or previous college grade point average (GPA) of 2.25 or higher.
- Achieve at least a composite score of 50 on the most current version of the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS); TEAS score must be from within three years of anticipated date of matriculation.

Students who have successfully completed the AS/AAS GSN, and meet the requirements listed below, may be considered for acceptance into the prelicensure ASN/AASN or BSN program. ASN/BSN cohorts have capacity limits, therefore a student meeting the below requirements may be placed on a waitlist until space is available.

- Successful completion of the AS/AAS GSN program with a Grade point average (GPA) in the AS/AAS GSN of 2.50 or higher, 2.8 or higher for Atlanta students (minimum of 24 credits completed in residence)
- Completion of Anatomy & Physiology I and II with a B or better, in no more than 2 attempts
- Completion of the following courses with a C or better, in no more than 2 attempts:
 - *NSG 120 Pathophysiology
 - *NSG 124 Pharmacology
 - **SC 166 Microbiology
 - **SC 186 Chemistry

*A minimum grade of 76% is required to earn a C in courses with an NSG prefix

**A minimum grade of B or better is required for Atlanta students in SC 166 and SC 186

Online BSN Requirements

Applicants must meet all the following criteria:

- A high school or previous college grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher.
- Achieve at least a composite score of 66 on the most current version of the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS); TEAS score must be from within three years of anticipated date of matriculation.
- Students who have failed one or more nursing courses at a previous institution are not eligible to enroll in the online BSN.
